# **Committee Reports**

Training, Education, and Equipment Committee [TEEC]

The Griffiths III Training Course 2023 was launched in 2023 which has streamlined the course and introduced new video material. Videos of children undertaking the tasks are now integrated into the subscale teaching. There are also some clarifications of scoring and interpretation. This course can be taken by registered users who wish to undertake a refresher course. This course can also be undertaken by users of the previous versions of Griffiths scales who wish to become registered Griffiths III users. Details are on the ARICD website.

A Virtual Tutor meeting was held on Saturday November 25th

8.30–10.30. The purpose was to introduce the changes to the Griffiths III training course including the launch of the updated Video training Course 2023 which has streamlined the course and introduced new video material.

ARICD requirements for Griffiths III registration were also covered. Updates to the Tutor training pathway and resources available to tutors was also covered. This was followed by discussion. The second half of the meeting was a talk given by the team from NMU with Professor Louise Stroud, Dr Jenny Jansen and Dr Johan Cronje entitled "You have a completed Griffiths III assessment, now what? From base rates to quartile charts and a whole lot more". Again, this was followed by discussion. There were 28 attendees from around the world and feedback was very positive. We hope to repeat this 6 monthly.

Courses continue to expand worldwide and many thanks to all of you who contribute to helping to run courses and widen the use of Griffiths III.

#### Research Committee

I am very pleased to announce that members of the ARICD Research team presented at the European Congress of Psychology 2023 July 3rd – 6th in Brighton UK. There were two short papers presented by Professor Louise Stroud ("A Tapestry of Change: Seeing the Pandemic Child Through a Lens of Authentic Developmental Assessment" and "Disaggregation of normative data offers a clinical solution to incomplete standardised testing."). This was followed by a Symposium led by Professor Stroud with other members of the Research Committee contributing on the topic: "More to children's rights and development than meets the eye: the climate crisis, the Covid–19 pandemic and the Griffiths III". This was very well received and many members of the Hogrefe team attended.

Griffiths III Gauge work as described in our previous newsletter is well underway in several countries worldwide with some interesting feedback already. More pilot testers, however, are still needed. If you are interested in taking part in this very interesting project to widen the use of Griffiths III please contact: research@aricd.ac.uk.

Translations and validations, especially of the spoken instructions to the child (verbal script), are underway in India, the Philippines, Indonesia, Israel, and finalised in Quebec Canada.

There is also joint translation and validation work between country based professionals and ARICD linked to the STREAM project in India and Malawi and the validation of the Global Scales of Early Development (GSED) against Griffiths III as a gold standard in Pakistan, Malawi, and Tanzania which is supported by the WHO.
