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President's Report

The 6 months since the December Newsletter have continued to be very busy time for the ARICD Trustees and Committee members. It is important to acknowledge the tremendous contribution from all those involved on behalf of ARICD – many thanks to a great team.

Griffiths III Development Gauge

I am very pleased to announce the start of the pilot study of the Griffiths III Development Gauge and ask those interested in taking part to write to research@aricd.ac.uk. The Gauge is a method of short assessment which will indicate whether a full Griffiths III assessment is needed. This could be particularly useful in clinics where there are many children to review but only some needing a complete assessment. The Gauge will help prioritise the high-risk children in a busy service. It will use the existing Griffiths III kit and will be able to be accessed by registered Griffiths III users only to provide a quick gauge of development.

There will be a flexible approach to testing and reporting by the Gauge testers, for example testers can choose the children they see (typically or atypically developing) and use the Gauge alone or in combination with a full assessment with Griffiths III.

European Congress of Psychology

I am also very pleased to announce that members of the ARICD Research team will be presenting at the European Congress of Psychology 2023 July 3rd – 6th in Brighton UK.

There will be two short papers presented by Professor Louise Stroud ("A Tapestry of Change: Seeing the Pandemic Child Through a Lens of Authentic Developmental Assessment" and "Disaggregation of normative data offers a clinical solution to incomplete standardised testing.").

This will be followed by a Symposium led by Professor Stroud with other members of the Research Committee on the topic: "More to children's rights and development than meets the eye: the climate crisis, the Covid-19 pandemic and the Griffiths III"

Griffiths III Training

Training for Griffiths III continues to be very active around the world and in the last 6 months practical courses have run in Australia (many venues) Portugal (Lisbon and Porto), Ireland (many venues), South Africa (Cape Town and Johannesburg), UK (Oxford, London and Edinburgh), Israel and New Zealand. Research Committee

Griffiths III Development Gauge

In 2023 the Research Committee has been working on the Griffiths III Development Gauge preparing it for its initial pilot. As mentioned last Newsletter, we are now ready to welcome more members to the development of a research development

Open Access Paper

We have a further open access paper published in February. Green, E.M. and Stroud, L.A. (2023) *Reporting Children's Development below the Test Floor: Looking Back and Forth to Describe Individual Strengths and Needs.* Health, 15, 122–133. https://doi.org/10.4236/health.2023.152010

This paper documents the final phases of a project looking at the various possibilities of ways to report those children who have a flat profile of strengths and needs on the statistical results as their abilities fall below the floor of the test. The Journal Health enjoys publishing papers which have a provocative aspect, so we added in an additional theme of Children's rights and their right to have an assessment which shows their strengths and needs. As a result of the paper, we were asked to present the paper at an international Data Analytics Conference, but the notice was too short to attend. We have also been invited to submit the paper as a chapter in the book 'New Advances in Medicine and Medical Science'.

Translations

Translation with some validation if necessary is continuing in various stages in a number of different countries, usually translation of the verbal instructions given to the child is sufficient as many of the testers have a good command of English.
